- Learn what is necessary to be courteous in our social lives and how to do these things ourselves.


And last but not least, we will get to meet Nasreddin Hodja!

CONCEPTS

When we read this book we will learn concepts such as:

- Numbers 1-10
- Linear concepts (before, now, after)
- Nature concepts (happiness, jealousy, sadness)
- Time concepts (yesterday, today, tomorrow, week)
 - To be tired, to rest
 - Thin - Fat
 - Tall - Short
 - Hot - Cold
 - Stinginess
