




Has the Thief no Crime?

WHAT WE WILL LEARN

When we read this book we will:

- Improve our vocabulary and our control of the language that we use.
- Develop our reading abilities.
- Learn polite and courteous phrases and when to use them.
- Guess what the text says based on the illustrations.
- Learn the names of the parts of the day and how to use them properly.
- Learn what is necessary to be courteous in our social lives and how to do these things ourselves.
- Learn from Nasreddin Hodja's vast knowledge about right and wrong.
- Learn to understand sequences of events.
- Improve our ability to investigate something that has happened.
- Learn to make a plan for the things you want to do in the day
- Understand the relationship between the causes and effects of things that happen.
- Learn to look for who, what, when, where, why and how in what we read.

And last but not least, we will get to meet Nasreddin Hodja!

CONCEPTS:

When we read this book we will learn concepts such as:

- Concepts regarding time (day, month, season)
- Animals and sounds (Donkeys, roosters, birds)
 - Fast - Slow
 - Far – Near
 - Old – New
 - Hot - Cold
 - Before – After
 - Open – Closed
- To be tired – To rest
- To increase – To decrease
